

Dear Parents / Caregivers

I hope this newsletter finds you safe and well. I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to all the staff who have worked so hard to ensure a great start to the school year under the red traffic light system. Classes are very settled and students are enjoying being at school and learning alongside their friends. As a school we are working hard to minimise disruption to learning and school organisation with the current requirements for home isolation. School attendance has been good.

Thank you for supporting us by keeping your child home if unwell and following the isolation rules. Please note, symptoms seen in children includes having a sore tummy as well as normal flu-type symptoms. While not a Ministry of Education requirement, as we are now beginning to see an increase in the number of positive cases in the community, we will be informing parents by Hero if a positive case is symptomatic while at school in your child's class, so you can monitor your child for symptoms. It is still only household contacts that need to be isolated and it is safe for your child to be at school following all the health and safety precautions we have in place.

I hope you all enjoy the photos from the Senior School trip to Motueka. Learning in the field, acquiring new skills, challenging each learner and representing the school values reflects the way things are done at Motupipi School.

Motupipi School remains open in Stage 2 of our Omicron Plan with school open and operating as usual with the chance of fewer students on site. We remain fully staffed. Should we move to Stage 3 and switch to a hybrid model of online and onsite learning then teachers have work available for those children isolating at home. ## **Purim Festival**




