The Education Review Office (ERO) reviewed our policies, processes, systems, achievement data, and progress. We are overjoyed to announce that their findings reflect what a great school we are - we have embedded processes across most areas (this is good!) and we even excel in numerous areas across the board! The Review process further echoes the priorities that we as a school have already identified - furthering our cultural responsiveness journey, embedding our Mohua Local Curriculum with resources from manawhenua and continuing to improve student outcomes in Writing.

I feel incredibly privileged to work alongside such a talented and dedicated team and fantastic community. Together, we have created an environment where our vision of 'Making a Difference Together' comes alive. In Term 2, we should get the final evaluative report, and we look forward to sharing it with you all.

Thank you all for your attendance at our recent Goal Setting Hui. 
